MITE Enrichment

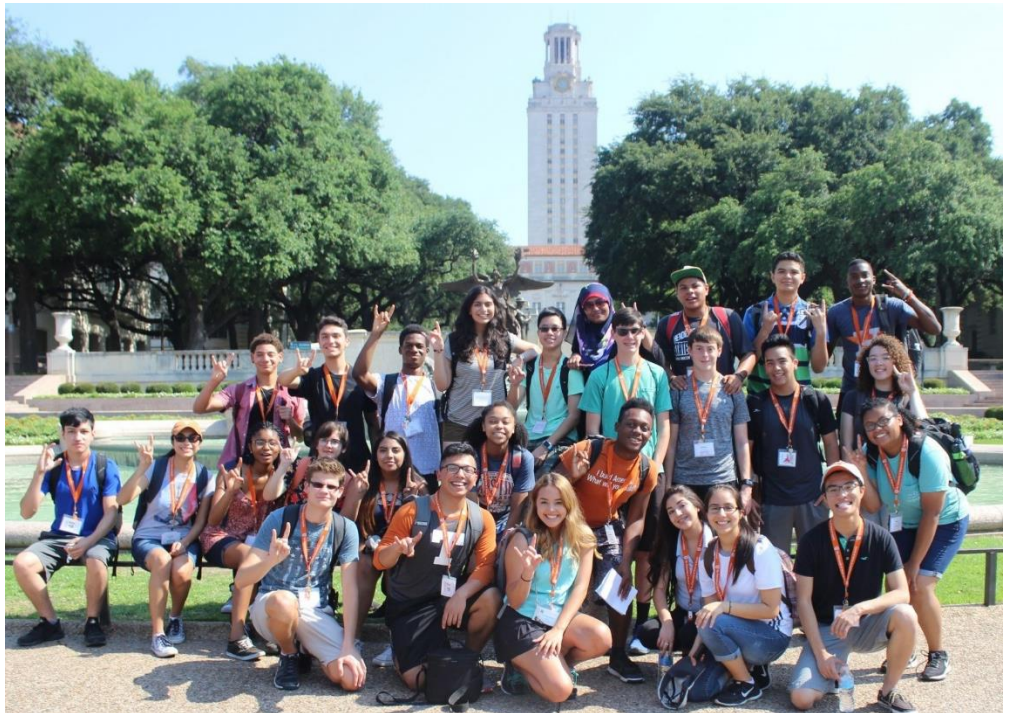
Program participants are housed in a campus dorm. All program expenses (including housing and food) are paid for, with the exception of travel to and from The University of Texas at Austin. Fifty students will be selected to attend each session.

first-generation students are strongly encouraged to attend. However, high school juniors of all backgrounds with an interest in engineering, math and science are welcome.

- Online Application
- Student Resume
- Parent Acknowledgement Form (English or Spanish)
- Recommendation Form completed by a science, math, or engineering teacher
- High School Counselor Form
- Official High School Transcript
- Additional documents and \$75 non-refundable deposit are required upon acceptance
